Saint-Cergue to La Dôle

Moyen - Sunday, 31 October 2021

This hike starts at La Chenalette just behind Saint Cergue village at 1100m. From here we go through the hamlet of 'La Saint-Cergue' and across fields via Le Vuarne in order to reach La Dôle summit (1677m). We then go down to the auberge at La Barillette, passing by 'La Barillette télésiège' and descend back to Saint-Cergue, completing the circuit. Walking time is approximately four hours.

Elevation gain: 577m

Length: all day

To bring:

Appropriate clothing, good boots, hat, picnic lunch, water, spare warm layers, waterproof rain gear, sun screen, sun glasses, walking poles (if you use them), Swiss francs.

Please bring a mask to wear during the car journeys.

Anyone in trainers/running shoes will be turned away.

Transport: carpooling or train to Saint Cergue. From the train station, there is a walk of perhaps 15 minutes to the starting point at La Chenalette. Please arrange to be at the starting point by 9.45 am.



Price: CHF 5 club tax (CHF 15 for non-members) plus CHF 11 to be paid directly to the driver.

Please note that in the event of bad weather and rain, the hike will be cancelled. I will inform everyone the day before.
