

# Dent de Lys Sunday *12 June 2022*

difficult (T3+)

The **Dent de Lys (2013m)** together with the Moléson are dominating the Fribourg Pre-Alps. On a clear day it provides fantastic views. We will go by train to **Les Sciernes** and hike to the summit via Col de Lys and end in **Les Paccots**. This is a difficult hike that requires good fitness and has several scrambling sections that require the use of hands (mostly secured by chains). In addition, the final ridge is fairly exposed and requires a sure foot and no fear of heights. The hike is very similar in difficulty to Dent d'Oche.
