EINSIEDELN-ZUG-CHERRY BLOSSOM TRAIL WEEKEND OF 27 AND 28 APRIL 2024 – MEDIUM/EASY

We spend a weekend in Central Switzerland, hiking over rolling green hills with views of the famous cherry blossoms in Zug.

Day 1- Saturday, 27th April 2024 (19km, +720m/-860m, 5.5 hours) – Einsiedeln to Unterägeri



We take an early train from Geneva to Einsiedeln, which is home to the famous Einsiedeln Abbey. We will start gradually ascending from Einsiedeln through pasture lands and alpine meadows towards Lake Aegeri, which is nestled beautifully into the surrounding rolling hills and framed by green hills and meadows on all sides. The route will follow an old pilgrim's trail past the mountain bogs of Rothenturm and offers views of the Central Alps. We will have our well-earned dinner and spend the night at the Hotel Freihof on the shores of Lake Aegeri.

Day 2- Sunday, 28th April 2024 (19km, +555m/-469m, 5 hours) – Zug to Goldau



From our hotel in Unterägeri we take a bus to Zug and pick up the cherry blossom trail.

The trail takes us through the old town of Zug and along and above Lake Zug through meadows and little villages where – with a bit of luck – we will see the cherry blossoms and their beauty. We will have small stops on route to enjoy the views and finish the day in the lakeside village of Goldau with a coffee and a slice of Zuger Kirschtorte. Arth-Goldau station is well connected and from here the group can make its way back to Geneva.

To bring: Toiletries and essentials for overnight stay, sufficient layers, Jacket/Jumper for evening, Picnic for day 1, snacks, hiking poles (if preferred), hiking boots, suncream, sunglasses, hat/cap, raincoat. If you have dietary requirements please bring your own suitable snacks and let me know in advance so I can find a suitable restaurant.

Transport and Meeting Point: Train/Bus from Geneva to Einsiedeln on Saturday and back from Arth-Goldau on Sunday. All participants are responsible for their own tickets for arrival and departure and tickets can be purchased in advance on www.sbb.ch. **Meeting point at 6.45 am Saturday on**Platform 4 at Geneva Cornavin station. Departure at 6.59 to Bern and Einsiedeln via Zürich and Wädenswil. The total journey will take around 4 hours and I will join the group at Zürich Main Station. Anyone who wishes to travel up the night before is welcome to do so, meeting point is Einsiedeln station at 11am on the Saturday morning.

Return Journey: We will travel back from Arth around 16.00 or later, depending on the progress we make on the day. Please arrange your own travel.

Price and Deposit: CHF 10 club fee for SCIG members, 30 CHF for non-members; train tickets (to be purchased individually) plus food and accommodation.

Accommodation: Hotel Freihof in Unterägeri, CHF 75pp on average, breakfast optional, choice of single and double rooms, <u>www.freihof-aegeri.ch</u>. Rooms are already booked.
