## Baraque de Divonne, Ain

Max alt. 1200m, Height gain/loss  $\pm 440$ m, Easy

Saturday 20 September 2025

This is an easy hike through the woods in the foothills of the Jura. We will start in the charming village of Vesancy and soon reach the Chapelle de Riantmont which we will be able to visit. From there we follow a largely flat jeep track through the trees with occasional views across to Lac Lemman until we reach Carrefour du Comte. From here we climb in order to complete a loop in the track and there is the option to climb still further to reach the Baraque de Divonne (1200m), before returning the way we came to Vesancy.

**To bring:** Appropriate clothing, hiking boots, hat, picnic lunch, water, spare warm layers, waterproof rain gear, sun screen, sun glasses, walking poles, euros and passport.



**Rendezvous:** 9.45 am at the Ancienne Gare bus stop in Divonne-les-Bains.

**Hiking time:** about 3½ hours

**Maximum participants:** 16

**Transport:** car pooling/bus and train

**Journey details:** It is possible to reach Divonne Ancienne Gare bus stop on public transport but cars are then needed to reach Vesancy. Drivers can either transport fellow hikers from Geneva (or indeed from anywhere else along the train line, such as Coppet) and go to Vesancy directly or could collect hikers from Divonne. I will liaise with those who volunteer to drive accordingly. The journey from Divonne to Vesancy takes approximately ten minutes.

**Price:** CHF 5 club tax (CHF 15 for non-members) plus an amount to be paid directly to the driver. I will calculate the amount/s once I know where drivers are collecting fellow hikers but the maximum is unlikely to exceed CHF 10.
