This snowshoe trail starts at the village of La Lécherette and climbs to the top of Les Monts-Chevreuils at 1,749 metres. It's a tranquil climb on a groomed trail, allowing the time to admire the gorgeous scenery around you. At the halfway point, Lake Hongrin and its imposing dam come into view before the final ascent. Then, below, the Monts-Chevreuils hut offers a splendid view of the villages of Les Moulins and Château-d'Oex, where you can see the famous Le Temple hill.
